In an age marked by rapid scientific progress, existential questions about life, death, and the afterlife remain poignant. Media representations of the paranormal, from ghost-hunting reality shows to horror films, have fueled public fascination with exploring communication with the afterlife. Moreover, during widespread events such as the COVID-19 pandemic, individuals experienced increased interest in spiritualism and the metaphysical. The Spirit Box app is said to serve as a digital conduit for personal exploration and connection to lost loved ones during times of grief, uncertainty, or solitude.

People who were not religious tended to believe in both religion based supernatural phenomena and non supernatural phenomena at similar rates.

Religious traditions often incorporate elements of paranormal communication. In Christianity, the concept of saints interceding on behalf of believers can be viewed as a form of communication between the mortal and the divine. Additionally, practices such as prayer, visions, and dreams are considered ways individuals can receive messages from the spiritual realm (Froes & Jones 2021). Although Angels were often associated with religions who use The Old Testament as a religious text, but the idea of a guardian angel is now also believed in by those who do not follow The Old Testament. For example in the US society of today, people of all religious and nonreligious beliefs support the claim of a guardian angel who protects them from harm (Draper and Baker 2011). This study helps to show that there are similarities between faiths and non different types of supernatural phenomena. Similarly, in many Indigenous cultures, ancestral spirits play a vital role in guiding and protecting the living, further embedding paranormal practices into the social fabric.

Eastern philosophies also contribute to the understanding of paranormal communication. In Buddhism, there is a belief in multiple realms of existence, including that of spirits (Roberts, 2008) Ghost festivals and rituals in countries like China showcase the importance of honoring ancestors and connecting with the spiritual world. Such traditions have historically provided individuals and families with a means to transcend the temporal realm through rituals and ceremonies.

In various African religions, a core principle is the existence of a spiritual world inhabited by ancestors, spirits, and deities. Ngubane (1997), in his book 'The Mind of a Zulu Woman,' points out that these belief systems often consider ancestors to be actively involved in the lives of the living, acting as guides and guardians. Communicating with these ancestors is a way to seek counsel, safety, and blessings. In cultures such as the Yoruba in Nigeria, ancestor veneration is integral. According to Abimbola (2006) in "The Yoruba and their Religion," rituals, such as offerings and prayers, facilitate interactions between the living and the dead. Divination systems, such as Ifa, serve to mediate these communications, allowing practitioners to receive messages from the divine or ancestral spirits.

The increasing interaction between cultures due to expansion and globalization has facilitated the exchange of beliefs surrounding paranormal communication. As cultures interacted, practices such as spiritualism emerged during the 19th century, particularly in

the Western world, as people began seeking evidence of life after death through mediumship. This era marked a significant shift in how societies viewed spiritual communication, moving from ancient practices to organized beliefs and investigations (Norenzayan, 2013)

Development of Paranormal Investigations

The spiritualism movement, highlighted by public séance gatherings and the rise of mediums, intrigued many educated figures, including scientists and philosophers. During this time, various groups, such as the Society for Psychical Research (SPR) established in the UK in 1882, were formed to explore claims of the paranormal. The SPR sought to scientifically examine phenomena like telepathy, clairvoyance, and mediumship using strict methodologies (Braude, 2016).

Advances in technology in the early 20th century made further indoor investigations possible. Paranormal communication can now be studied in a more systematic way thanks to the invention of recording devices, photography, and electronic voice phenomena (EVP). As a result of these tools, researchers began documenting experiences and phenomena more rigorously, which led to the development of methods for capturing evidence of purported spirit interactions (Gordon, 2020). With the rise of modern paranormal investigation groups in the late 20th and early 21st centuries, the field has expanded significantly, embracing technology and scientific inquiry while also maintaining elements of traditional practices. Ghost hunting has become a popular pastime, with numerous television shows and documentaries aimed at captivating audiences through investigations of haunted locations (Norris, 2019). This shift not only reflects a changing landscape in beliefs surrounding the supernatural but also indicates how consumer culture has influenced the perception and investigation of paranormal phenomena.

According to studies by French and Stone (2012), factors such as suggestion, expectation, and cognitive biases significantly influence people's experiences of ghostly phenomena. The psychological approach posits that belief in ghosts is often intertwined with personal experiences, trauma, and the human need for meaning, as outlined in Tylor's (2014) work on animism and its modern implications.

Scientific Approach: Emerging in response to the need for empirical verification, the scientific approach to ghost hunting has gained traction in recent decades. Investigators using this method rely on instruments such as EMF meters, infrared cameras, and audio recorders to gather data. Researchers like Bartholomew (2010) advocate for a skeptical yet open-minded approach, suggesting that while many claims of paranormal activity remain unsubstantiated, a systematic investigation may sometimes yield unexpected findings. Moreover, the work of Roberts et al. (2015) explored how methodological rigor can lend credibility to investigations traditionally dismissed as pseudoscience.

Role of Science in Paranormal Investigations

The intersection between science and paranormal investigations is a contentious and often polarizing topic. While many skeptics argue that paranormal phenomena can be explained by natural, psychological, or social factors, others advocate for a more nuanced perspective that allows for scientific inquiry into the unknown.

Skepticism and Belief: Isaac Asimov (1975) posited that the human inclination to perceive patterns even in random data can lead to false conclusions regarding paranormal occurrences. This perspective is echoed by the scientific community, where skepticism plays a crucial role; however, those who engage in ghost hunting often experience a cognitive dissonance between their beliefs and the skepticism they encounter. Bridger's (2013) work highlights the struggle faced by investigators wishing to balance their belief systems with scientific scrutiny.

Technology in Investigations: The use of technology has transformed paranormal investigations, allowing ghost hunters to collect objective data that was previously unattainable. Advances in audio and visual recording devices, as well as environmental monitoring tools, have made it possible to capture evidence of alleged paranormal activity. The study by Gill and Knott (2018) examined how technology serves dual roles: as a means of investigation and as a propellant for belief. Their findings suggest that the existence of unexplained data despite efforts to rationalize—may bolster believers' claims and encourage ongoing exploration.

Review of Skepticism and Criticism for Paranormal Phenomena

Throughout history, there has been curiosity and conjecture about paranormal phenomena, a wide range of occurrences that lack a scientific explanation, such as clairvoyant experiences, ghostly apparitions, and red-eyed aliens. From ancient shamanistic practices to the philosophical inquiries of the Enlightenment, spirituality has evolved, and so has our relationship with technology. In recent years, we have witnessed a resurgence of interest in spirituality, particularly among millennials and Gen Z. This demographic is increasingly turning to mindfulness apps, online meditation classes, and virtual reality experiences designed to foster spiritual engagement. As we examine this intersection, it is crucial to understand that technology is not a replacement for traditional spiritual paths but rather a complement to them.(James &Carter 2021)

The exploration of paranormal phenomena—ranging from ghosts and hauntings to near-death experiences and UFO sightings—has led to the development of various theoretical frameworks. Here are some prominent models that underlie current paranormal research:

1. Psychological and Sociocultural Theories

These theories posit that many experiences attributed to the supernatural may stem from cognitive biases, social influences, or individual psychological states. For instance, the *Pareidolia Effect* suggests that humans are wired to recognize patterns (such as

faces) in randomness, which can lead to sightings of apparitions or entities in otherwise benign stimuli.

2. Negative Criticism: Some users didn’t find the App useful, some of them said it was fake. Sharing her review of the App, Patricia Roysdon said; “something is not quite right. Besides ads interrupting every couple minutes, the responses have a different echo to them than the radio station sounds. Also the speed of the spoken words in the responses doesn’t change with sweep rate changes. Suspicious. Uninstalled.”

3. Constructive Criticism: However, not all feedback is overwhelmingly positive. Some users report experiencing technical issues, such as crashes or difficulties in navigating the interface. Another user Kgosi Kgosithaba remarked; I almost got an heart attack, I will never try this again”

Scientific Perspective

A careful analysis demonstrates that there isn't any scientific support for the app, despite its popularity. The answers produced by the Spirit Box Communicator, according to detractors, are frequently the result of chance, pareidolia—the propensity to recognize patterns in unfamiliar stimuli, such voices amid background noise—or cognitive biases (Lange et al., 2019). Participants utilizing EVP equipment, such as apps like Spirit Box, found it difficult to discern between real paranormal communication and random noise in a

research by the Society for Psychical Research (Braude et al., 2022). Scientists further stress that the psychological and technological processes at work do not lend credence to the idea of actual afterlife contact. Rather, they highlight the impact of suggestion and expectation, wherein individuals could unconsciously perceive unclear noises as important signals (Parker, 2019).

According to Campbell (2018) Technological advancements have dramatically transformed the methods used in paranormal investigations, allowing researchers to probe the unknown with unprecedented precision. From electronic voice phenomena (EVP) recordings to infrared thermography and psychophysiological sensors, technology has opened new avenues for evidence collection.

1. Enhanced Evidence Gathering

Modern technology allows for a more rigorous investigation of paranormal claims. Tools like electromagnetic field (EMF) meters, digital audio recorders, and thermal imaging cameras provide empirical data that can be analyzed quantitatively. This approach contrasts sharply with anecdotal evidence often associated with paranormal studies and lends greater credibility to findings. The ability to analyze recorded data can also reveal patterns that may be overlooked using traditional methods.

2. Virtual Reality and Simulation
